YOUR MONEY QUESTIONS

Awhile back, I asked you what you'd like to know about money matters and you sent in some great questions. I answered a few but there are more I'd love to answer for you! This one comes from Skyler at Pine Tree Federal Credit Union.



Q: Where does the money go?

You may wonder where your money goes when you give it to a teller at your credit union. Are they keeping it in a back room with your name on it? Do they put it in a safe? Are they sending it somewhere?

A: When you deposit cash, the physical cash might stay in the teller's drawer or may go to the credit union's cash reserves, which is a certain amount of cash they keep on hand to meet withdrawal requests. The value of the cash you deposit is recorded in your account as a "credit" which means the credit union owes you that money. They can then use that money to make loans to other members.
